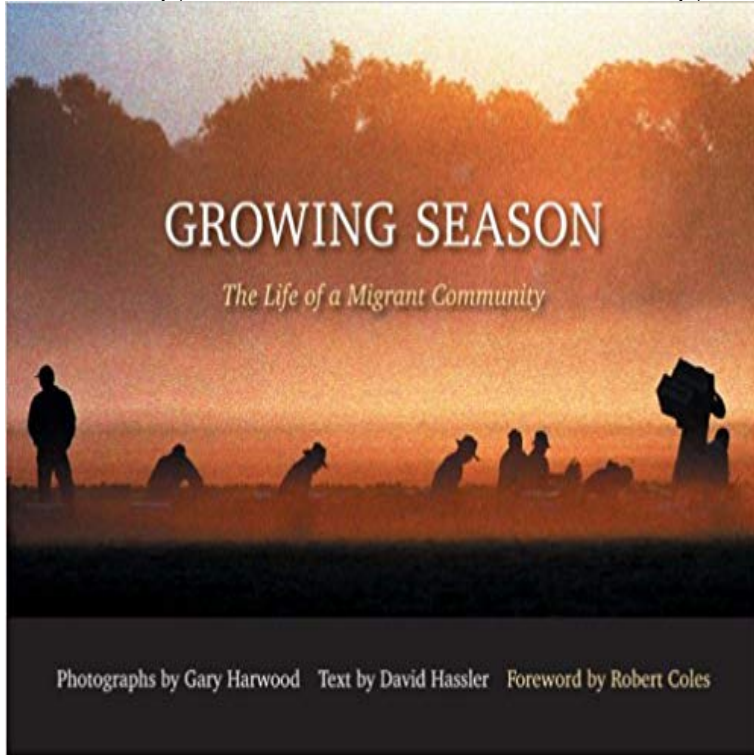


# Growing Season: The Life of a Migrant Community
