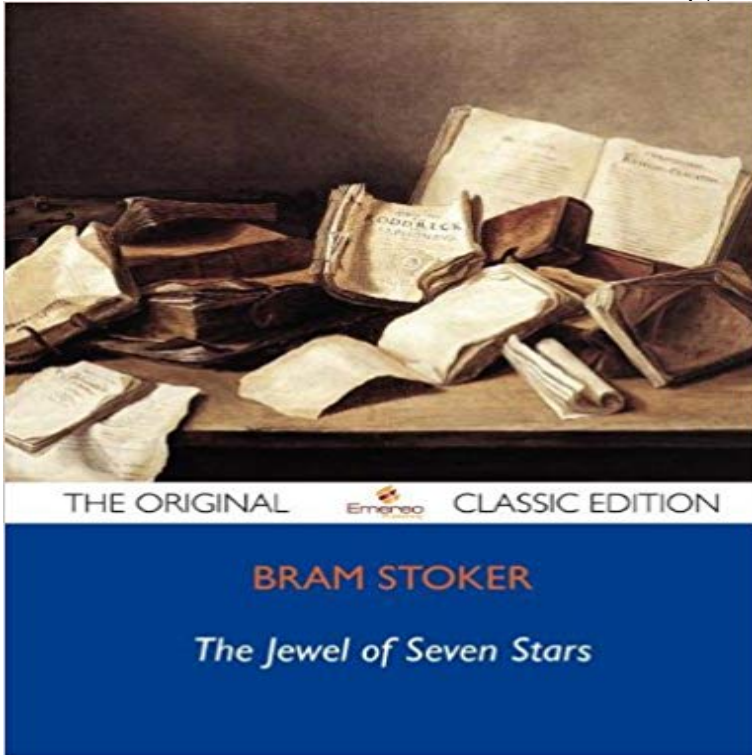


The Jewel of Seven Stars - The Original Classic Edition
